Care & Cleaning

- Before you lift or reposition your monitor, it is better to disconnect the cables and power cord. Follow the correct lifting techniques when positioning the monitor. When lifting or carrying the monitor, grasp the edges of the monitor. Do not lift the display by the stand or the cord.



1.3 Monitor introduction

1.3.1 Front/Side view



1. **(** 5-way) button

- Turns on the OSD menu. Enacts the selected OSD menu item.
- Increases/Decreases values or moves your selection up/down/left/right.
- Turns on the OSD menu when the monitor enters standby mode or displays the "NO SIGNAL" message.

2. X button

- Exits the OSD menu item.
- Toggles the Key Lock function between on and off with a long press for 5 seconds.
- Turns on the OSD menu when the monitor enters standby mode or displays the "NO SIGNAL" message.

3. \nearrow 1 button

- · Default: GamePlus.
- To change the shortcut function, go to the Shortcut > Shortcut 1 menu.
- Turns on the OSD menu when the monitor enters standby mode or displays the "NO SIGNAL" message.




- 1. **DC IN port.** This port connects the power cord.
- HDMI-1 port. This port is for connection with an HDMI compatible device.
- HDMI-2 port. This port is for connection with an HDMI compatible device.
- DisplayPort-1. This port is for connection for a DisplayPort compatible device.
- DisplayPort-2. This port is for connection for a DisplayPort compatible device.
- **6. USB 3.2 Gen 1 Type-B**. This port is for connection with a USB upstream cable. The connection enables the USB ports on the monitor.
- USB 3.2 Gen 1 Type-A. These ports are for connection with USB devices, such as USB keyboard/mouse, USB flash drive, etc.

1.3.3 GamePlus function

The GamePlus function provides a toolkit and creates a better gaming environment for users when playing different types of games. The crosshair overlay with 6 different crosshair options lets you choose the one that best suits the game you're playing. There are also on screen timer and stopwatch you can position on the left of the display so you can keep track of the gaming time; while the FPS (frames per second) counter lets you know how smooth the game is running. Display Alignment displays alignment lines on 4 sides of the screen, serving as an easy and handy tool for you to line up multiple monitors perfectly.

2.1 Assembling the monitor arm/base

- 1. Insert the base into the arm.
- 2. Fix the base to the arm by fastening the bundled screw.



2.3 Adjusting the monitor

- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling when you change its angle.
- The recommended adjusting angle is +20° to -5° (for tilt)/+25° to -25° (for swiveling)/ +100 mm (for height adjustment).






It is normal that the monitor slightly shakes while you adjust the viewing angle.



2.4 Detaching the arm (for VESA wall mount)

The detachable arm of this monitor is specially designed for VESA wall mount.

To detach the arm:

- 1. Have the front of the monitor face down on a table.
- Use a screwdriver to remove the covers on where the monitor and the arm meet.
- Loosen the four screws on the back of the monitor and remove the arm/ base.






We recommend that you cover the table surface with soft cloth to prevent damage to the monitor.



- The VESA wall mount kit (100 x 100 mm) is purchased separately.
- Use only the UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket with minimum weight/load 22.7kg (Screw size: M4 x 10 mm)

2.5 Connecting the cables

Connect the cables as the following instructions:



• To connect the power cord:

- a. Connect the power adapter securely to the monitor's DC IN input.
- Connect one end of the power cord to the power adapter and the other end to a power outlet.

To connect the DisplayPort/HDMI cable:

- a. Plug one end of the DisplayPort/HDMI cable to the monitor's DisplayPort/ HDMI port.
- Connect the other end of the DisplayPort/HDMI cable to your computer's DisplayPort/HDMI port.
- To use the earphone: connect the end with plug type to the monitor's earphone jack.
- To use the USB 3.2 Gen 1 ports: Take the supplied USB cable, and plug
 the smaller end (type B) of the USB upstream cable to the monitor's USB
 upstream port, and the larger end (type A) to your computer's USB port. Make
 sure your computer is installed with the lastest Windows 10/Windows 11
 operating system. That will enable the USB ports on the monitor to work.



When these cables are connected, you can choose the desired signal from the Input Select item in the OSD menu.

2.6 Turning on the monitor

Press the power button. See page 1-3 for the location of the power button. The power indicator lights up in white to show that the monitor is ON.

3.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) menu


3.1.1 How to reconfigure



- 1. Press the () button to activate the OSD menu.
- 2. Move the \blacksquare (\bigcirc) button up/down to navigate through the functions. Highlight the desired function and press the \blacksquare (\bigcirc) button to activate it. If the function selected has a sub-menu, move the \blacksquare (\bigcirc) button up/down again to navigate through the sub-menu functions. Highlight the desired submenu function and press the \blacksquare (\bigcirc) button or move the \blacksquare (\bigcirc) button right to activate it.
- 3. Move the \equiv (\bigcirc) button up/down to change the settings of the selected function.
- 4. To exit and save the OSD menu, press the \times button or move the \equiv (\bigcirc) left repeatedly until the OSD menu disappears. To adjust other functions, repeat steps 1-3.

1. Gaming



• Variable OD: Improves the gray level response time of the LCD panel.

 Adaptive-Sync (DP)/ Variable Refresh Rate: Allows an Adaptive-Sync supported* graphics source to dynamically adjust display refresh rate based on typical content frame rates for power efficient, virtually stutter free and low-latency display update.



To activate Adaptive-Sync (DP)/ Variable Refresh Rate, turn off ELMB function first.

*Adaptive-Sync (DP)/ Variable Refresh Rate can only be activated within 48Hz~160Hz for HDMI, and 48Hz~160Hz for DisplayPort.

*For supported GPUs, minimum PC system and driver requirements, please contact the GPU manufactures.

- ELMB/ELMB SYNC: ELMB can only be activated when Adaptive-Sync (DP)/ Variable Refresh Rate is Off and the refresh rate is 120Hz, 144Hz, 150Hz or 160Hz. ELMB SYNC allows you to turn on the function when daptive-Sync (DP)/ Variable Refresh Rate is On. This function eliminates screen tearing, reduces ghosting and motion blur when playing games.




Please refer to the following to alleviate eye strains:





6. MyFavorite



- Shortcut:

7. System Setup



- Language: There are 22 languages for your selection, including English, French, German, Italian, Spanish, Dutch, Portuguese, Russian, Czech, Croatian, Polish, Romanian, Hungarian, Turkish, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Thai, Indonesian, Persian, Ukrainian.
- Sound: Sets the sound related settings from this menu.
 - Volume (Earphone Out): The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
 - Mute: Toggles the monitor sound between on and off.
- **USB Hub**: Turns On/Off the USB Hub function during standby mode.



This function is not available (set as **On During Standby**) when **Aura Sync** is enabled.

- **Power Indicator:** Turns the power LED indicator on/off.
- Power Key Lock: Enables or disables the power key.


3.2 Aura

Armoury Crate is a software program that controls the colorful LEDs on supported devices, such as monitors, motherboards, graphic cards, desktop PCs, etc. Aura allows you to adjust the color of the RGB LEDs on these devices and select different light effects. You can also correct or adjust the color of the LEDs by calibrating them.

To activate Aura:

- 1. Turn ON the **Aura Sync** function in the OSD menu.
- 2. Connect the USB 3.2 Gen 1 upstream port of the monitor to the USB port of your computer.
- 3. Install Armoury Crate and then restart the computer.
- 4. Execute Armoury Crate.

Below is the overview of this program.





- If the USB upstream connection between the monitor and computer is disconnected, to resume the Aura function, you need to re-connect the USB 3.2 Gen 1 upstream port of the monitor to the computer and then restart the computer.


