Searching by keyword


Click **Edit** > **Advanced Search**. Enter the keyword (text) for information you want to find in the search window, and then click **Search**. Hits are displayed as a list. Click one of the displayed hits to jump to that page.



Jumping directly from bookmarks

Click a title to jump to that page. Click + or > to view the lower level titles in that section. To return to the previous page, perform the following operation on your keyboard.

- Windows: Hold down **Alt**, and then press ←.
- Mac OS: Hold down the command key, and then press \leftarrow .



Printing only the pages you need

You can extract and print only the pages you need. Click Print in the File menu, and then specify the pages you want to print in Pages in Pages to Print.

• To specify a series of pages, enter a hyphen between the start page and the end page. Example: 20-25

• To specify pages that are not in series, divide the pages with commas. Example: 5, 10, 15



Projector Parts - Front/Side




Name		Function
0	Front adjustable feet	When setup on a surface such as a desk, turn to extend and retract the feet to adjust the horizontal tilt.
2	Remote receiver	Receives signals from the remote control.

		Caution Do not hold or hit this part as doing so may cause it to deform.	
4	Focus lever cover	Open to access the focus lever.	
5	Air filter cover	Open to access the air filter.




Name		Function
0	Motion sensor	Detects movement near the projection window and reduces the brightness of the light source for safety.
		The detection range may vary depending on the temperature of the surroundings.
		Movement may not be detected through transparent material such as glass.

Nan	Name		Function	
2	Projection window	Images are projected from the lens inside the projector.		
			 Warning Do not look into the projection window while projecting. Do not place any objects or put your hand near the projection window. It could cause burns, fire, or the object to warp because this area reaches a high temperature due to the concentrated projection light. 	
3	Security slot	The security slot is compatible with the Microsaver Security System manufactured by Kensington.		
4	Air exhaust vent	Exhaust vent for air used to cool the projector internally.		
			While projecting, do not put your face or hands near the air exhaust vent, and do not place objects that may become warped or damaged by heat near the vent. Hot air from the air exhaust vent could cause burns, warping, or accidents to occur.




Name		Function	
0	USB-A port	Connects a commercially available USB device such as a webcam, external HDD, or keyboard. Connects a commercially available RJ45 adapter to enable wired LAN connections. This port is not guaranteed to operate for all devices that support USB.	
2	HDMI1 port HDMI2 (eARC/ARC) port	Inputs video signals from HDMI compatible video equipment and computers. This projector is compatiwith HDCP 2.3. The HDMI2 port is compatible with HDMI eARC at ARC.	

Name		Function
3	DC Out (2.0A) port	Provides a connection for an optional or commercially available streaming media player allowing you to power it. USB data transfer is not available.
4	Optical Out port	Outputs audio from the current input source to an external audio device by connecting an optical digital audio cable.
5	Service port	This port is used by service technicians and should not normally be used.
6	Air intake vent	Takes in air to cool the projector internally.
7	Power inlet	Connects the power cord to the projector.



2	Air intake vent (air filter)	Takes in air to cool the projector internally.
3	Front adjustable feet	When setup on a surface such as a desk, turn to extend and retract the feet to adjust the horizontal tilt.
4	Air intake vent	Takes in air to cool the projector internally.




Projector Placement

Install the projector on a table in your living room or on a low shelf to project images.




Note the following points when selecting a projector location:


• Place the projector on a sturdy and level surface.



• If the image is tilted, rotate the front feet to adjust their height.



- Leave plenty of space around and under the projector for ventilation, and do not place it on top of or next to anything that could block the vents.
- Place the projector so it squarely faces the screen, not at an angle.





If you cannot install the projector squarely facing the screen, correct any resulting keystone distortion using the button on the remote control. For the best quality images, we recommend adjusting the installation position of the projector to achieve the correct image size and shape.

Marning

Do not install the projector in a location subject to high levels of dust or humidity, or in a location subject to smoke or steam. Otherwise, it could cause a fire or electric shock to occur.

Marning

- Do not cover the projector's air intake or air exhaust vents. If the vents are covered, the internal temperature could rise and cause a fire.
- Do not use or store the projector in locations where it will be subject to dust or dirt. Otherwise, the quality of the projected image may decline, or the air filter may become clogged, resulting in a malfunction or fire.
- Do not install the projector on an unstable surface or in a location beyond the weight specifications of the projector. Otherwise, it could fall or topple causing an accident and injury.
- When installing the projector in a high position, take measures to prevent falling by using wires to ensure safety in an emergency, such as an earthquake, and to prevent accidents. If it is not installed correctly, it could fall causing an accident and injury.
- Do not install in locations where salt damage could occur, or in locations subject to corrosive gas such as sulphuric gas from hot springs. Otherwise, corrosion could cause the projector to fall. It could also cause the projector to malfunction.

Attention

- Make sure you do not operate the projector in the following positions.
 - Do not operate the projector on its side.
 - Do not project images straight up or straight down.
 - Do not tilt the projector right or left.
- If you are using the projector at altitudes above 1,500 m, set the **High Altitude Mode** setting to **On** in the projector's menu to ensure the projector's internal temperature is regulated properly.



Connecting to Video Sources


If your video source has an HDMI port, you can connect it to the projector using an HDMI cable and send the image source's audio with the projected image.


Attention

Do not turn on the video source before connecting it to the projector. Doing so could damage the projector.



- If the port on the device you connect has an unusual shape, use the cable supplied with the device or an optional cable to connect to the projector.
- Some video equipment is capable of outputting different types of signals. See your video equipment manual to confirm what type of signals can be output.
- When sending 18 Gbps images such as 4K 60Hz 4:4:4, use an HDMI cable (premium-high speed). If you use an incompatible cable, images may not be displayed correctly.





Connecting to External USB Devices

By connecting any of these devices to your projector, you can project images and other content or play audio without using a video device.

- Microphone
- USB flash drive
- Digital camera
- USB hard drive




- USB-A port is not guaranteed to operate all devices that support USB.
- You may need an app to project content from your USB device.
- USB hard drives must meet these requirements:
 - USB Mass Storage Class-compliant (not all USB Mass Storage Class devices are supported)
- Formatted in FAT16/32
- Self-powered by their own AC power supplies (bus-powered hard drives are not recommended)
- Avoid using hard drives with multiple partitions



If your USB device came with a power adapter, plug the device into an electrical outlet.

Connect the HDMI cable to your video source's HDMI output port.

Connect the USB device to the projector's USB-A port as shown.



Attention


- Use the USB cable supplied with or specified for use with the device.
- If the USB cable is too long, the device may not operate correctly. We recommend using a USB cable that is three meters or less.
- If you use a USB hub, the device may not operate correctly. We recommend checking the operation in advance.
- Connect the other end to your device, if necessary.

Connecting to External Audio Devices

If your amplifier or speaker has an optical digital audio input port, you can connect it to the projector using an optical digital audio cable and project audio from the image source.

Connect the optical digital audio cable to your audio device's optical digital audio input port.

Connect the other end to the projector's Optical Out port.





To change the audio settings, you can set **Sound Output** in the projector's **Sound** menu.




Connecting to a Streaming Media Player

You can connect your streaming media player to the projector's HDMI port. By connecting the power supply USB cable, you can power the streaming media player from the projector.

Connect your streaming media player to the projector's HDMI port.



Connect the power supply USB cable to the projector's DC Out port.



3 Connect the other end to the streaming media player.


Use the cable supplied with or specified for use with the media streaming device.

Connecting to an eARC/ARC Compatible AV System

If your AV system or speakers, such as a sound bar, has an HDMI port, you can connect them to the projector using an HDMI cable (with Ethernet) to output audio to these devices.

Connect the HDMI cable to your AV system's HDMI output port (eARC or ARC compatible).

Connect the other end to the projector's HDMI2 (eARC/ARC) port.





- To output audio from the projector's HDMI2 (eARC/ARC) port, set **HDMI2 ARC** to **On** and **Sound Output** to **ARC** (**Auto**) or **eARC** in the projector's menu.
- **☞** Settings > HDMI CEC > CEC Control > HDMI2 ARC
- \bigcirc Sound > Sound Output
- If you want to output higher quality audio from the projector's HDMI2 (eARC/ARC) port, set **Sound Output** to **ARC (Auto)** in the projector's **Sound** menu.
- When playing Android TV contents, audio is output in 2 ch (L-PCM).
- See the *Supplemental A/V Support Specification* for eARC/ARC audio supported formats.



Remove the battery cover as shown.




Remove the old batteries, if necessary.



Dispose of used batteries according to local regulations.


Insert the batteries with the + and - ends facing as shown.



Marning

Check the positions of the (+) and (-) marks inside the battery holder to ensure the batteries are inserted the correct way. If the batteries are not used correctly, they could explode or leak causing a fire, injury, or damage to the product.

Replace the battery cover and press it down until it clicks into place.





Remote Control Operation

The remote control lets you control the projector from almost anywhere in the room.

It is recommended that you aim the remote control at the projector's receivers within the distance and angles listed here.






The projector may not respond to commands if you use the remote control in conditions with bright fluorescent lights or in direct sunlight. If you are not going to use the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries.

When you turn on the projector for the first time, you need to setup Android TV.



You can change each of the settings even after completing the initial setup. Press the button on the remote control to display the menu and change the settings.

- Turn on the projector.
- When the paring screen is displayed, hold down the [Enter] button and button on the remote control at the same time to pair the remote control and the projector.






When pairing starts, the indicator on the remote control flashes. When pairing is complete, the indicator turns off.

When pairing ends, follow the on-screen instructions to make the necessary settings.

When the language selection screen is displayed, select the language you want to use.



- When the Wi-Fi setting screen is displayed, select the wireless network you want to use, and then follow the on-screen instructions to make necessary settings.
 - An internet connection is required to view online content. Make sure you can use the Wi-Fi service.
 - The customer is responsible for any communication charges incurred when downloading the app or watching online content.
- 6 When the login screen is displayed, sign in using your Google Account.
 - You can download various popular apps and games on Google Play by signing in with your Google Account.
 - You can also create a Google Account on your computer or smart device.

When you have finished the initial setup, the home screen is displayed.





Turning On the Projector

When you connect the video equipment to the projector, turn on the video equipment you want to use after you turn on the projector.

Connect the power cord to the projector's power inlet and plug it into an electrical outlet.



The projector enters standby mode. This indicates that the projector is receiving power, but is not yet turned on.

Press the power button on the projector or remote control to turn on the projector.

The status indicator flashes blue as the projector warms up. Once the projector is warmed up, the status indicator stops flashing and turns blue.

The first time you turn on the projector, the remote control pairing screen and initial setup screen are displayed. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the settings.

Marning

- Never look into the projector lens when the light source is on. This can damage your eyes and is especially dangerous for children.
- When turning on the projector at a distance using the remote control, make sure there is no one looking into the lens.
- During projection, do not block the light from the projector with a book or other objects. If the light from the projector is blocked, the area on which the light shines becomes hot which could cause it to melt, burn, or start a fire. Also, the lens may get hot due to the reflected light which could cause the projector to malfunction. To stop projection, turn off the projector.



When using at an altitude of 1,500 m or more, set High Altitude Mode to On.

Turn off the projector after use.



- Turn off this product when it is not in use to prolong the life of the projector. Light source life varies depending on the mode selected, environmental conditions, and usage. Brightness decreases over time.
- Hold and press the power button on the projector or remote control. Select **Power Off** on the displayed screen.

The light source turns off, and the status indicator turns off.



A short press of the power button puts the projector into suspended mode, and it will continue to operate under minimal power even if the power is turned off. This lets the projector start quickly the next time you turn it on.


To transport or store the projector, make sure the status indicator on the projector is off, and then unplug the power cord.



Correcting Distortion in the Image


When the projected image is curved or not rectangular, you can correct distortion in the projected image by following the on-screen instructions.

After correction, your image is slightly smaller.




To correct distortion more easily, you can use the Epson Setting Assistant application on a smart phone or tablet that has a camera function. Install the application by using the QR code displayed on the projected screen. The customer is responsible for any communication charges incurred when downloading the app.


- Turn on the projector and display an image.
- Press the button on the remote control.



While looking at the marks at the upper right and upper left of the screen, adjust the focus using the focus lever.



Follow the on-screen instructions to correct distortion in the image.





You can use the button on the remote control to close the menus.



Adjusting Image Color

When projecting on to a wall, you can use the preset color correction to compensate for the color of the wall.


You can make further detailed color adjustments in the projector's **Picture** menu.

- Turn on the projector and display an image.
- Press the button on the remote control.



3 Select **Adjust color** and press the [Enter] button.

Select the color that is closest to the color of the wall, select **OK**, and then press the [Enter] button.

You can adjust the brightness of your projector's light source.




This function is not available when a problem has occurred.

- Turn on the projector and display an image.
- To decrease or increase the light output, press the or button on the remote control.

A light output gauge is displayed on the screen.

You can turn on Dynamic Contrast to automatically optimize the image luminance. This improves the image contrast based on the brightness of the content you project.

- Turn on the projector and display an image.
- Press the button on the remote control.
- Select the **Picture** menu and press the [Enter] button.



- Select one of the following options and press [Enter]:
 - **High Speed** to adjust brightness as soon as the scene changes.
 - Normal for standard brightness adjustment.
- 6 Press to exit the menus.

Selecting an Image Source

When multiple image sources are connected to the projector, you can switch from one image source to the other.

- Make sure the connected image source you want to use is turned on.
- For video image sources, insert a DVD or other video media and press play.
- **B** Do one of the following:
 - If you want to switch the image source to HDMI1 or HDMI2, press the button on the remote control.

Next, select the source you want to use from the screen displayed.

• If you want to switch the image source to the Android TV home screen, press the button on the remote control.



When no image signal is detected, check the cable connections between the projector and the image source.

The projector can display images in different width-to-height ratios called aspect ratios. Normally, the input signal from your video source determines the image's aspect ratio. However, you can change the aspect ratio for certain images to fit your screen.

If you always want to use a particular aspect ratio for a certain video input source, you can select it using the projector's **Picture** menu.



Changing the Image Aspect Ratio

You can change the aspect ratio of the displayed image.

- 1 Turn on the projector and display an image.
- Press the button on the remote control.

Select the **Picture** menu and press the [Enter] button.



- Select **Aspect Ratio** and press [Enter].
- Select one of the available aspect ratios for your input signal and press [Enter].
- 6 Press to exit the menus.

Available Image Aspect Ratios

You can select the following image aspect ratios, depending on the input signal from your image source.



• Note that using the aspect ratio function of the projector to reduce, enlarge, or split the projected image for commercial purposes or for public viewing may infringe upon the rights of the copyright holder of that image based on copyright law.

Aspect mode	Description
Normal	Displays images using the full projection area and maintains the aspect ratio of the image.
Full	Displays images using the full size of the projection area, but does not maintain the aspect ratio.
Zoom	Displays images using the full width of the projection area and maintains the aspect ratio of the image.

The projector offers different color modes to provide optimum brightness, contrast, and color for a variety of viewing environments and image types. You can select the mode designed to match your image and environment, or experiment with the available modes.



Changing the Color Mode

You can change the projector's **Color Mode** using the remote control to optimize the image for your viewing environment.

- Turn on the projector and display an image.
- Press the button on the remote control.

Select the **Picture** menu and press the [Enter] button.



- Select **Color Mode** and press [Enter].
- Select the color mode you want to use from the list and press [Enter].
- 6 Press to exit the menus.

Available Color Modes

You can set the projector to use these color modes, depending on your environment and image types.

Color mode	Description	
Dynamic	This is the brightest mode. Best for prioritizing brightness.	
Vivid	Best for enjoying content with bright colors.	
Cinema	Best for enjoying content such as movies.



To optimize the color tone according to the scene, and to obtain a more vivid image, correct the image by adjusting the **Scene Adaptive Gamma** setting.

- Turn on the projector and display an image.
- Press the button on the remote control.

Select the **Picture** menu and press the [Enter] button.



- Select **Custom Settings** and press [Enter].
- Select one of the following options:
 - To adjust the overall color brightness of the color, adjust the **Brightness** setting.

- There is a slight delay in the audio output from any Bluetooth device.
- You cannot connect multiple devices by Bluetooth at the same time.

- You may not be able to connect depending on the standard and type of device.

You may need to clean the projection window and motion sensor periodically, and clean the air filter and air vents to prevent the projector from overheating due to blocked ventilation.

The only parts you should replace are the air filter and remote control batteries. If any other part needs replacing, contact Epson or an authorized Epson servicer.



Marning

Before cleaning any part of the projector, turn it off and unplug the power cord. Never open any cover on the projector, except as specifically explained in this manual. Dangerous electrical voltages in the projector can injure you severely.

Clean the projection window periodically, or whenever you notice dust or smudges on the surface.

- To remove dust or smudges, gently wipe the projection window with clean and dry lens-cleaning paper.
- If the projection window is dusty, blow off dust using a blower, and then wipe the projection window.




- Before cleaning the projection window, turn off the projector and unplug the power cord.
- Do not use any flammable gas sprays such as air dusters to blow off dust. The high heat generated by the projector may cause a fire.

Attention

- Do not wipe the projection window right after you turn off the projector. Doing so could damage the projection window.
- Do not use any harsh materials to clean the projection window and do not subject the projection window to any impacts; otherwise, it could be damaged.

Cleaning the Motion Sensor

Clean the projector's motion sensor periodically, or if you see a message telling you to remove any obstacles that are interfering with the projection area. To remove dust or smudges, gently wipe the sensors with lens-cleaning paper.





Marning

Do not use a lens cleaner that contains flammable gas to clean the motion sensor. The high heat generated by the projector may cause a fire.

Attention

Do not use glass cleaner or any harsh materials to clean the sensors and do not subject the sensors to any impacts. Damage to the surface of the sensors may cause malfunctions.

Cleaning the Projector Case

Before cleaning the projector case, turn off the projector and unplug the power cord.

- To remove dust or dirt, use a soft, dry, lint-free cloth.
- To remove stubborn dirt, use a soft cloth moistened with water and mild soap. Do not spray liquid directly on the projector.

Attention

Do not use wax, alcohol, benzene, paint thinner, or other chemicals to clean the projector case. These can damage the case. Do not use canned air, or the gases may leave a flammable residue.

Regular filter maintenance is important to maintain your projector. Clean the air filter when a message appears telling you the temperature inside the projector has reached a high level. It is recommended that you clean these parts over a 12,000 hour period. Clean them more often than this if you use the projector in an environment that is dustier than expected. (Assuming the projector is used in an atmosphere in which airborne particulate matter is less than 0.04 to 0.2 mg/m3.)

Attention

If regular maintenance is not performed, your Epson projector will notify you when the temperature inside the projector has reached a high level. Do not wait until this warning appears to maintain your projector filter as prolonged exposure to high temperatures may reduce the life of your projector.




You need to clean the projector's air filters in the following situations:

- The filter or vents get dusty.

Cleaning the Air Intake Vents

Clean the projector's air intake vents periodically, or whenever you notice dust on the surface of the vents to prevent the projector from overheating due to blocked ventilation.




You can use the Panel Alignment feature to manually adjust the color convergence (the alignment of the red and blue colors) in the projected image. You can adjust the pixels horizontally and vertically in increments of 0.125 pixels within a range of \pm 3 pixels.



- You can adjust only the red or blue color convergence. Green is the standard color panel and cannot be adjusted.
- Image quality may decline after performing Panel Alignment.
- Images for pixels that extend beyond the edge of the projected screen are not displayed.
- Press the button on the remote control.
- 2 Select the **Settings** menu and press [Enter].



Select Panel Alignment and press [Enter].



- Select **Panel Alignment** and set it to **On**.
- Select **Select Color** and choose one of the following:
 - R to adjust the red color convergence.
 - **B** to adjust the blue color convergence.
- Select **Pattern Color** and choose the grid color displayed when making adjustments. The available color varies depending on the **Select Color** setting.
 - R/G/B to display the grid color in white.
 - R/G to display the grid color in yellow. R/G is only displayed when **Select Color** is set to R.
 - **G/B** to display the grid color in cyan. **G/B** is only displayed when **Select Color** is set to **B**.
- Select **Next** and press [Enter].
- Select **Select Method** and choose one of the following options:
 - Select **Whole Panel** to adjust the entire panel at the same time and go to the next step.

- Select **Four Corners** to adjust the corners of the panel one at a time and go to step 11.
- Use the directional pad on the remote control to adjust the color alignment selected in **Select Color**, and then press [Enter].



Adjustment affects the grid lines in the entire screen.

- **10** Select one of the following options:
 - Select Four Corners to fine-tune your adjustments.
 - Select **Exit** to finish adjustments.
- Use the directional pad on the remote control to adjust the color alignment of the screen corner, and then press [Enter].
- When you are finished adjusting each corner of the screen, press [Enter].
- **13** Select one of the following options:
 - If your projector needs additional panel alignment, select **Fine Adjustment**. Use the directional pad on the remote control to highlight the corner of any misaligned box on the screen, press [Enter], make any necessary adjustments, and then press [Enter] again. Repeat this step as necessary for the other intersections.
 - Select **Exit** to finish adjustments.



Solving Projector Power Problems

Solving Projector Shutdown Problems

If the projector turns off unexpectedly, try the following steps until the problem is solved.

The projectors may have entered standby mode after the interval of time specified in **Sleep Timer** in the projector's **Settings** menu has passed. Press the power button on the projector or remote control to wake the projector.



After waking the projector, **Sleep Timer** is automatically set to **Off**.

When the status indicator is lit orange, the projector has overheated and turned off.



The cooling fans may run in standby status depending on the projector settings. Also, when the projector wakes from standby status, the fans may cause an unexpected noise. This is not a malfunction.

Make sure that there are no obstacles interfering with the projection window. Remove any obstacles.

Solving Missing Image Problems

If no image is displayed, try the following steps until the problem is solved.

- Theck the projector's status:
 - Press the button on the remote control to see if the image was temporarily turned off.
 - Check the status indicator to confirm that the projector is in normal operating status.
 - Press the projector's power button to wake it from standby mode.
 - Settings > Sleep Timer
- **2** Check the cable connection:
 - Make sure all necessary cables are securely connected and the power is on for the projector.
 - Connect the video source directly to the projector.
 - Replace the HDMI cable with the shorter one.
 - When sending 18 Gbps images such as 4K 60Hz 4:4:4, use an HDMI cable (premium-high speed).

- Make sure you have selected the appropriate **EDID** setting in the projector's **Picture** menu, according to the standards supported by the video equipment, image signals, and HDMI cables.
- Check the status of your video source:
 - If you are projecting from a streaming media player, make sure it is powered by the power supply USB cable on the projector.
 - Turn on the connected streaming media player or video source, and press the play button to start a video, if necessary.
 - Make sure the connected device meets the HDMI CEC standard. See the documentation supplied with the device for more information.
 - If you are projecting from a laptop computer, make sure it is set up to display on an external monitor.
- **G** Check the following items:
 - You need an Internet connection to view online content. Make sure your Wi-Fi is on.
 - Turn off the projector and the connected streaming media player or video source, and then turn them back on.
 - Turn off the projector and the connected video source, and then turn them back on.
 - Set the CEC function for the connected device again and restart the device.
 - Make sure the computer's display resolution does not exceed the projector's resolution and frequency limits. If necessary, select a different display resolution for your computer. (See your computer manual for details.)
 - Resets all of the projector settings to their default values.

If there is no sound or the volume is too low, try the following steps until the problem is solved.

- Check the following settings on your video equipment:
 - Check your video source to make sure the volume is turned up and the audio output is set for the correct source.

- Set **Sound Output** to **ARC (PCM)** in the **Sound** menu.
- Make sure you are using an HDMI cable (with Ethernet).



When outputting audio to an external audio device that does not support HDMI ARC using an HDMI cable, set **HDMI CEC** to **Off** in the **Settings** menu.

If you want to output audio to an external audio device using an optical digital audio cable, check that the **Sound Output** setting is correct in the **Sound** menu.

Solving Bluetooth Speaker Mode Problems
