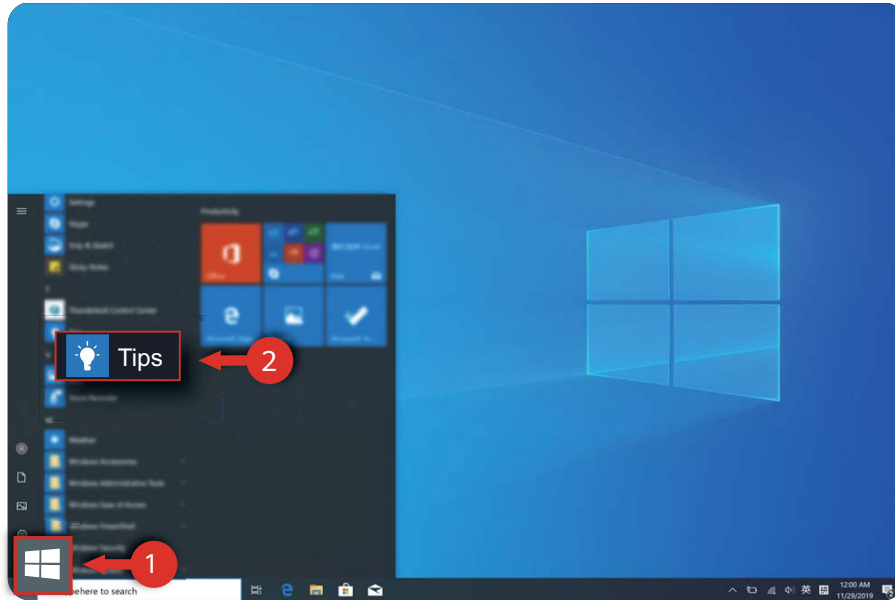

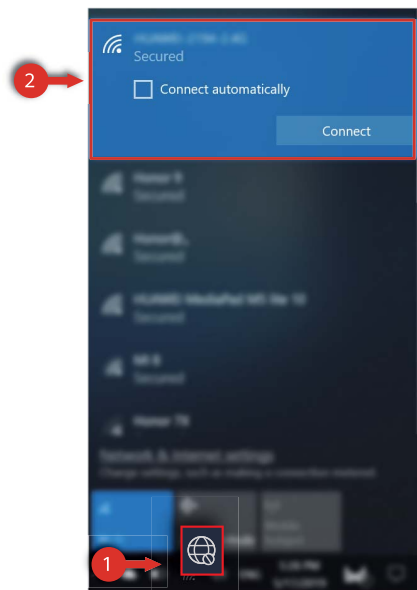

New devices

Step 1: Connecting to a network

- 1 Click  in the lower right corner of your desktop to open the Wi-Fi network connection screen.
- 2 Select the name of the Wi-Fi network you want to connect to and follow the onscreen instructions to establish a connection. Some Wi-Fi networks may require a network security key or password to establish a connection.




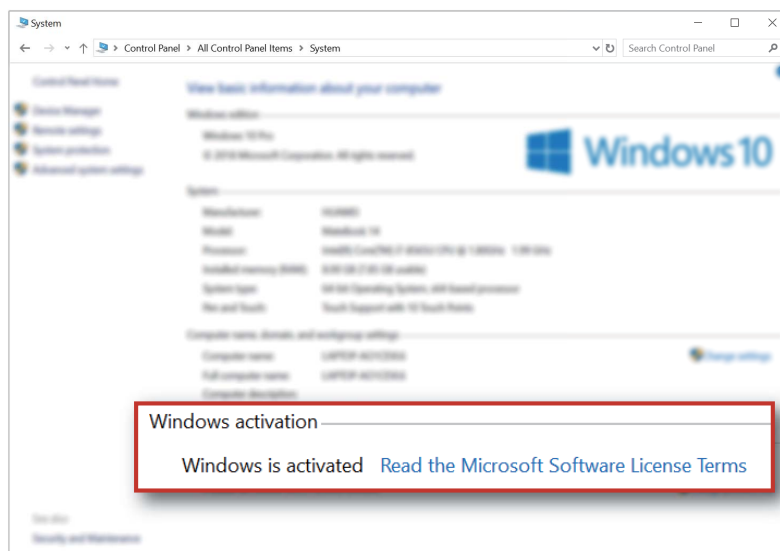
-  If the computer is connected to network for the first time, a dialog box will be displayed. Click **OK** and configure the settings as required.

Step 2: Activating Windows

Windows automatically activates upon the initial network connection. You can also check whether Windows is activated from the Control Panel.

If Windows activation fails, restart your computer and reconnect to the network; if the issue persists, connect to a different network or wait a moment and try again.

-  . If Windows is not activated, some features on your computer may be restricted.
 - Activating Windows may affect the return of the product. For more information, please refer to the product's warranty policy.

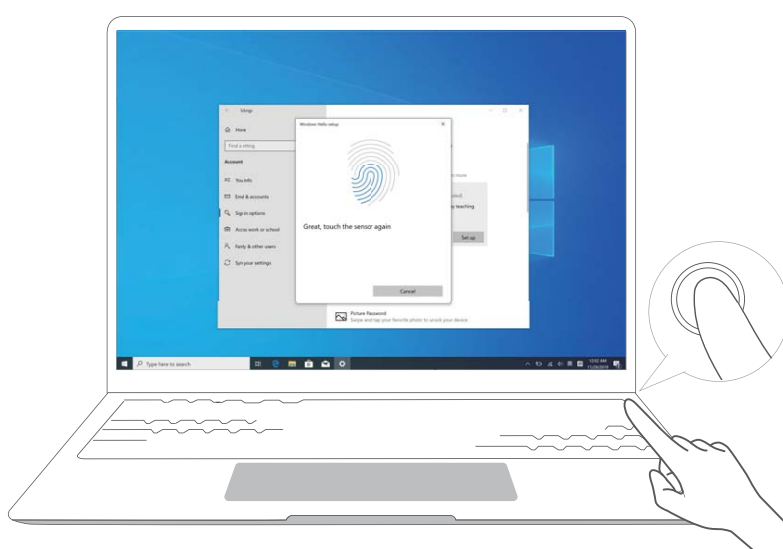


Step 3: Enrolling a fingerprint

Your computer utilizes a fingerprint-sensing power button. After enrolling a fingerprint, you can press the Power button to quickly and securely power on and unlock your computer, without the need to enter a password.

If you have skipped the fingerprint enrollment process during the initial setup phase, go to **Windows > Settings > Accounts > Windows Hello**. In **Windows Hello**, set your login password and PIN code, and then follow the onscreen instructions to enroll your fingerprints.

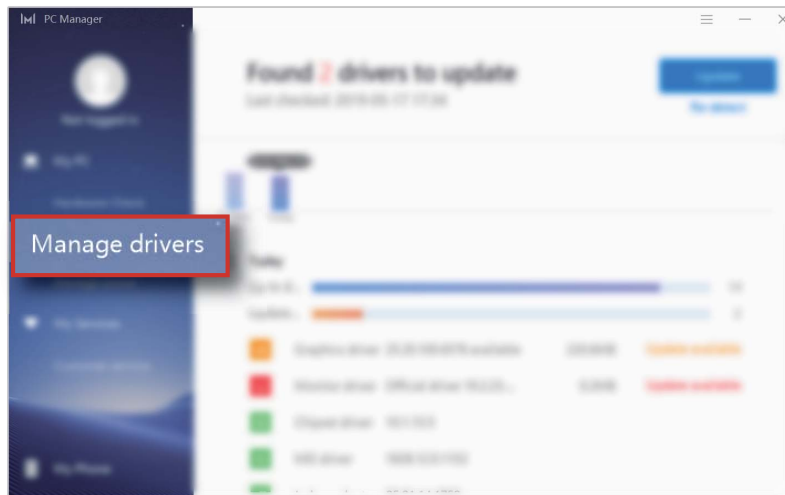
- Ensure that your fingers are clean and free of substances. Otherwise, it will affect the quality of the fingerprint enrollment.
- Each user can enroll up to 10 fingerprints per account.



Step 4: Updating the drivers

Open PC Manager and click **Manager drivers**. If a new driver update is available, follow the onscreen instructions to complete the update.

- i** For a better user experience, it is recommended that you check and update your drivers regularly to improve the stability and performance of your computer.



Highlighted features

Huawei Share OneHop

With Huawei Share OneHop, you can quickly transfer images, videos, and documents, as well as share clipboards and documents between your computer and phone, all without the need of a data cable.

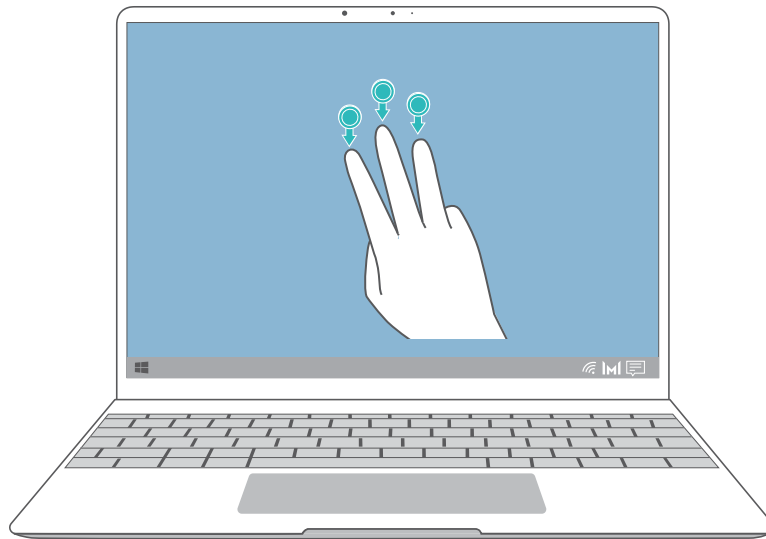
- **Multi-Screen Collaboration:** Once your phone is connected to the laptop, the phone screen will automatically pop up on the laptop. Easily maneuver around your phone with a larger screen!
- **OneHop File Sharing:** Transfers images, videos, and documents between your phone and computer at high speeds.
- **OneHop Screen Recording:** Shake your phone and tap to record your PC screen automatically for 60s. The recording will be saved to your phone for quick sharing.
 - **i** Currently, OneHop Screen Recording feature is only available on computers with the Intel chip.
- **OneHop Clipboard Sharing:** Allows you to copy content from your phone and paste it on your computer, and vice versa.


Using Finger Gesture Screenshot

Use Finger Gesture Screenshot to capture a window, the whole screen, or any part of the screen.

1. Swipe down with three fingers. The screen will dim and blue lines will appear on the screen.




2. See the list of gestures below. If you enter screenshot mode, but lift your fingers before completing any of these gestures, a screenshot will not be taken, but you will remain in screenshot mode.

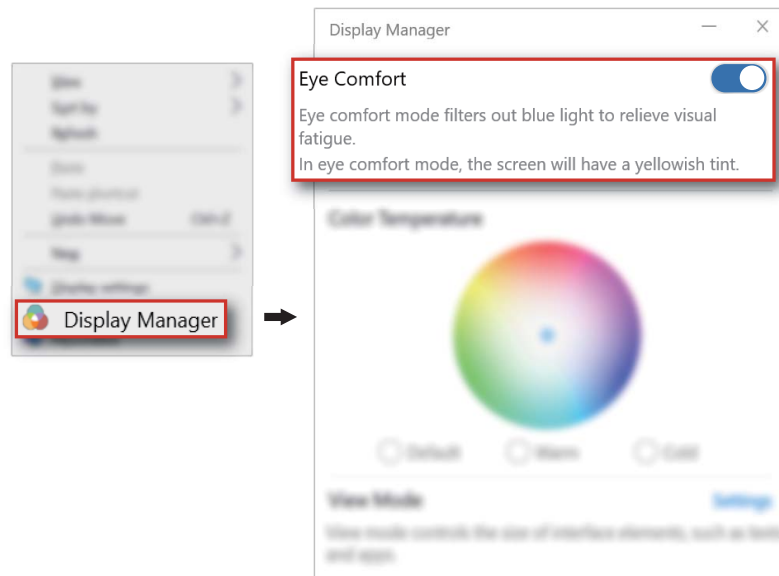
-  Selection: Draw a diagonal line to capture the rectangular area.
-  Window: Draw a diagonal line across a window to capture the window.
-  Screen: Touch the screen with one finger to capture the whole screen.
-  Custom: Draw an enclosed area to capture that part of the screen.
-  After capturing the screenshot, your computer will identify text in the image and display it to the right of the image. Select your desired texts to copy and paste.
 - Finger Gesture Screenshot is available on computers with PC Manager version 9.1 or later installed.
 - To enable or disable Finger Gesture Screenshot, open PC Manager, click , and go to the settings screen.

Eye Comfort mode

When reading for prolonged periods, enable Eye Comfort mode on your computer to reduce blue light output and prevent eye strain and fatigue.

Right-click any blank area on the desktop and select **Display Manager**. Enable **Eye Comfort**.

-  Eye Comfort mode reduces the amount of blue light emitted from the screen, which may give the screen a slightly yellow hue.



F10 system reset/factory reset

If your computer system encounters a serious problem as a result of a virus, malware, etc., the built-in F10 system reset/factory reset feature can quickly restore your computer to its initial or factory state.

i Before restoring the factory settings, back up all files on the drive C.

- 1** Connect your computer to the charger. Press and hold **F10** when powering on your computer to access the restore screen.
- 2** Follow the onscreen instructions to restore your computer to the factory settings.


Getting to know your computer

Powering your computer on/off

When powering on your computer for the first time, connect the power adapter and your computer will power on automatically. Moments after the screen lights up, your computer will enter the startup screen.

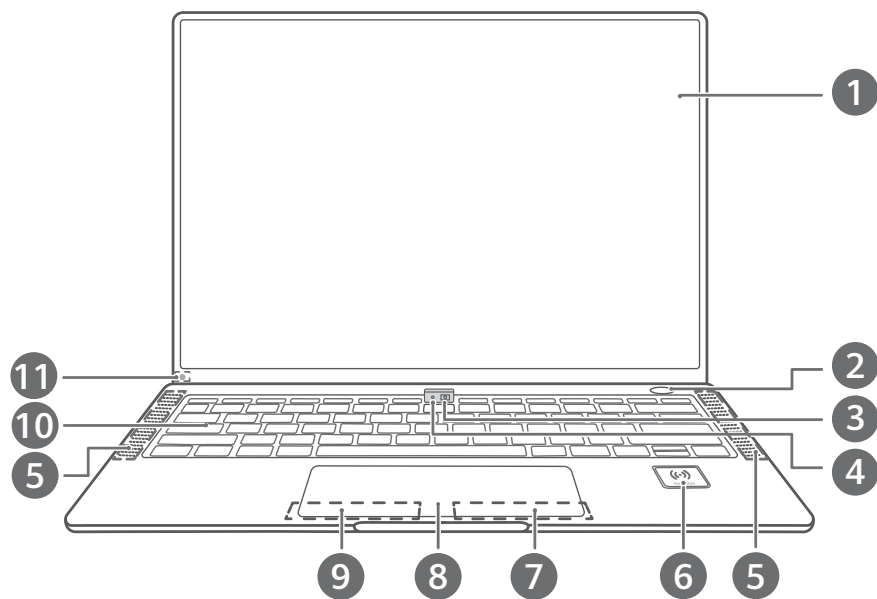
If the computer is powered off or asleep, press the Power button until the keyboard lights up to power on or wake up your computer.

If the computer is in normal use, click  >  to sleep, shut down, or restart your computer.



 **Forceful shutdown:** Press and hold the Power button for approximately 10 seconds. Forceful shutdowns may cause unsaved data to be lost. Please exercise caution.

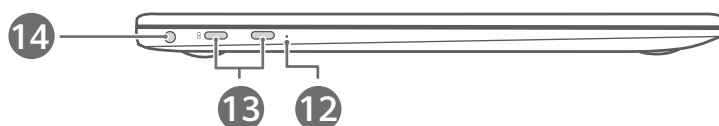
Front side



1	Touchscreen	Touch the screen to operate your computer.
2	One touch power button	<p>You only need to press the power button with the finger of which the fingerprint has been enrolled to power on your computer and unlock the screen. Safe and easy.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Press to wake the screen.• Press to unlock the screen.

3	Hidden camera	Press the button to open the camera lens and take photos or videos with the Camera app. Press the button again to hide the camera lens.

10	Keyboard	Enter letters, numbers, punctuation marks, and more.
11	Hidden ambient light sensor	Detects the ambient light level and automatically adjusts the screen brightness.  Do not cover the ambient light sensor. When purchasing a screen protector, choose a screen protector with a purpose-built hole for the ambient light sensor.

Keyboard

Shortcut keys

The F keys, such as F1 and F2, are used as shortcut keys (hotkeys) by default to perform multiple functions.

 F1	Decrease the screen brightness.
 F2	Increase the screen brightness.
 F3	Enable or disable the keyboard backlight, and adjust the backlight brightness.
 F4	Mute or unmute.
 F5	Decrease the volume.
 F6	Increase the volume.
 F7	Enable or disable the microphone.
 F8	Switch projection modes.
 F9	Enable or disable Wi-Fi.
 F10	Open Huawei PC Manager.




Switching between shortcut key mode and function key mode

The F keys have different functions depending on the software that is running.

You can use the F keys as function keys in two ways:

- Press the Fn key until the Fn key indicator turns on. The F keys will then work as function keys. Press the Fn key again until the Fn key indicator turns off. The F keys will then switch to shortcut key (hotkey) mode.
- To make the F keys work as function keys by default, open PC Manager and go to **Settings** > **System settings** to enable **Function key priority**. To switch to hotkey mode, enable **Hotkey priority**.

Touchpad

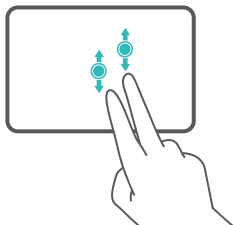

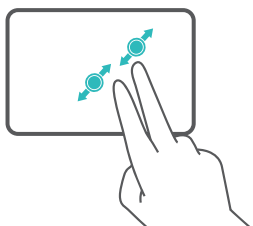

	Press the right touchpad button: Click the right mouse button.



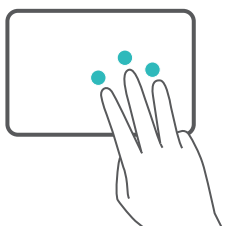

 - Automatically enable or disable the touchpad when a mouse is connected.
 - Change the touchpad scroll direction.
 - Configure touchpad gestures.

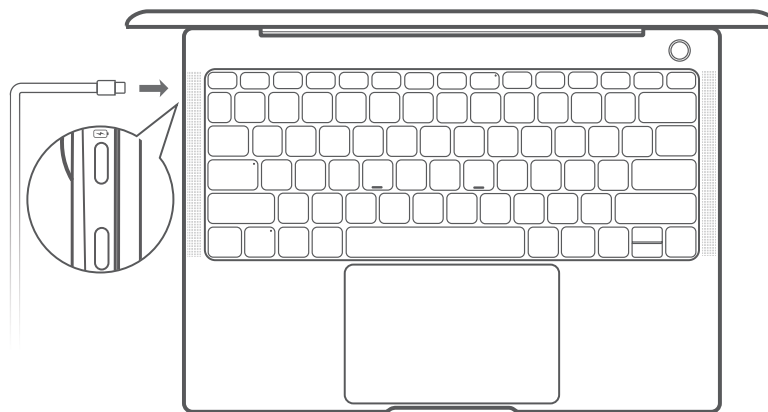


Charging your computer

Your computer will display an insufficient battery prompt when the battery is running low. In this case, please charge your computer in a timely manner to preventing your computer from entering Hibernate mode.

Charging your computer using the power adapter

Your computer features a built-in rechargeable battery. Connect the standard power adapter and USB-C charging cable to charge your computer, during which the charging indicator should flash white to indicate that the battery is charging. The battery charges faster when your computer is powered off or in Sleep mode.



⚠ Third-party accessories may present a potential safety hazard and impair performance.



Safety information

Charge your computer at room temperature in a well-ventilated area.

- ⚠** • Exposing your computer to high ambient temperatures during charging may damage the internal components.
- Charging duration may vary depending on the ambient temperature and the battery usage.
- Your computer may become warm after prolonged use or charging. If it becomes hot to the touch, disable non-essential features and disconnect the charger.

Battery status information


The battery status is indicated by the battery icon in the status bar.

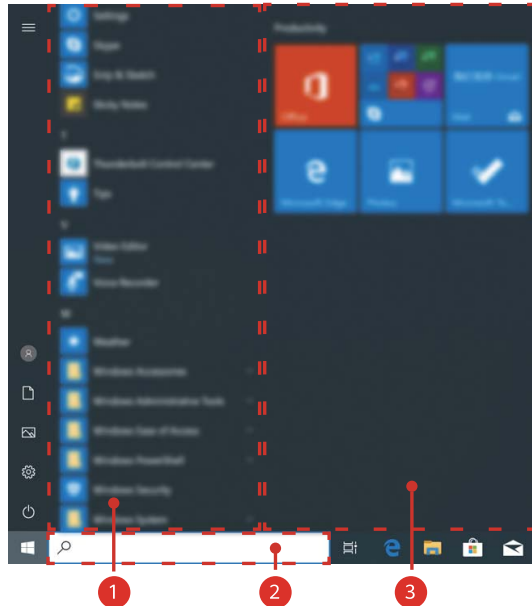
- When your computer is charging, the icon  will indicate that a charger is connected.
- When using your computer, you can view the remaining battery percentage and battery time by moving the cursor over the  battery icon.
- i** The remaining battery life displayed is a system estimation. The actual time may vary.
- ⚠** The battery is subject to wear. If the standby time of your computer appears to have reduced, do not attempt to replace the battery yourself. Instead, take your computer and proof of purchase to an authorized Huawei Customer Service Center for assistance.

Using the Start menu

Use the Start menu to access apps, settings, and files on your computer.


Click  in the lower left corner of your desktop to open the **Start** menu.



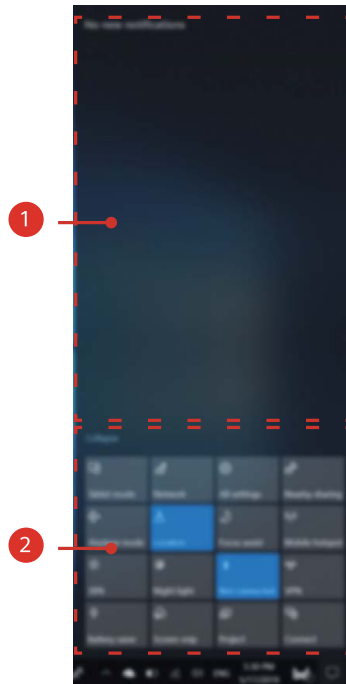
- Click  to change, lock, or log out of the current user account.
- Click  to access the **Document** folder.
- Click  to access the **Picture** folder.
- Click  to display the system settings screen.
- Click  to sleep, shut down, or restart your computer.
- **1** indicates the app display area, where you can swipe up or down on your screen to view all apps and programs.
- **2** indicates the search area, where you can enter the content you want to search for.
- **3** indicates the pinned tiles section, where you can pin your favorite apps or websites to the Start menu and organize them into groups.

Action center

Action center displays notifications such as system updates, as well as push notifications such as emails, and quick-access options that allow you to quickly enable or enable features or configure relevant settings.

By clicking  in the lower right corner of your desktop, you can:

- Quickly open Settings, VPN, and other screens.
- Quickly access frequently-used settings (such as the Power saving mode, Airplane mode, screen brightness, etc.).




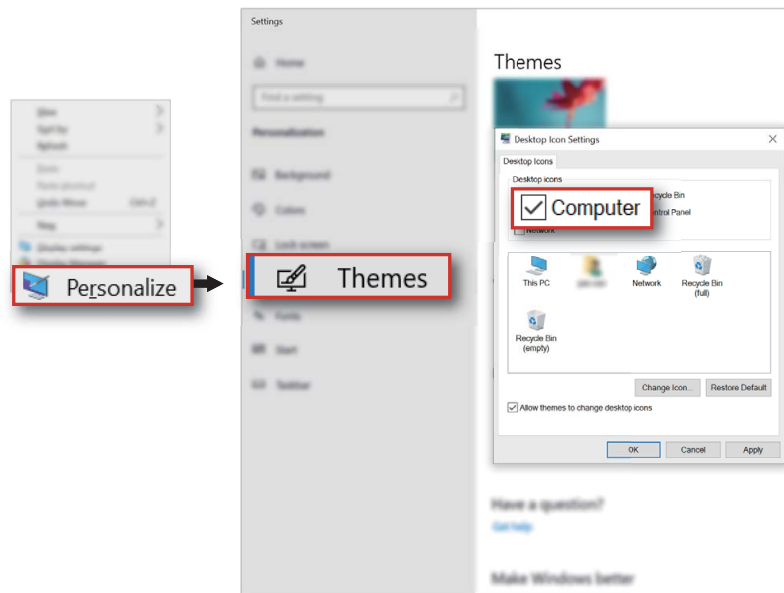

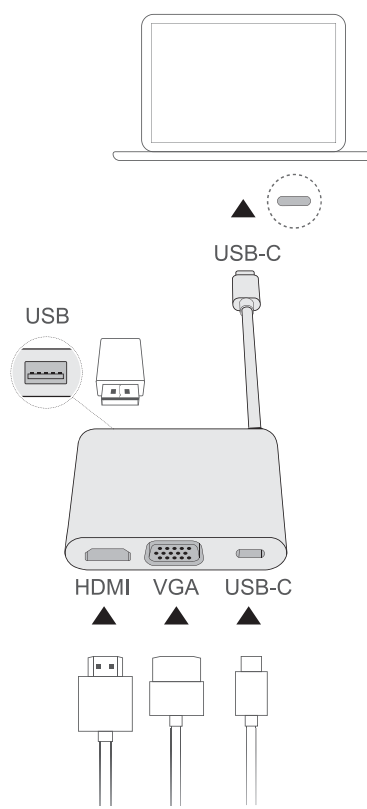

Getting to know your HUAWEI MateDock 2

Use the MateDock 2 to connect your computer to various external devices, including projectors, TVs, and USB flash drives.

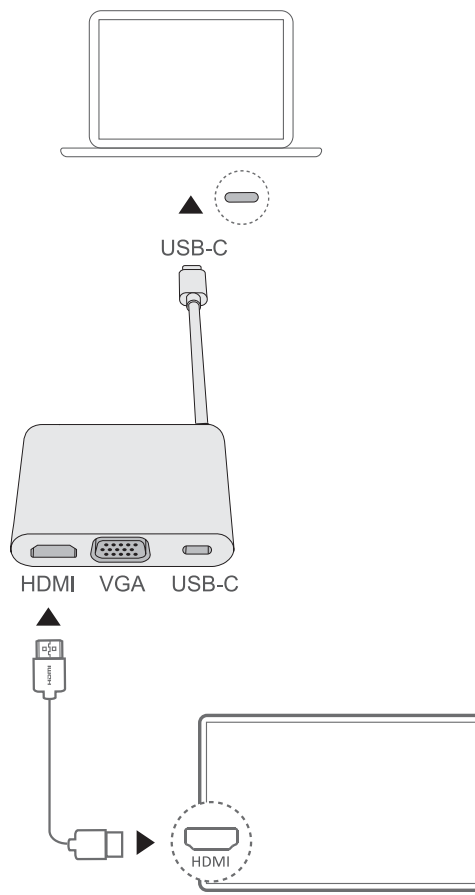



USB-C plug	Connect the USB-C port on your computer.
USB port	Connect devices with the USB-C port, such as a USB mouse, keyboard, storage device, or network adapter.
HDMI port	Connect an HDMI display device, such as a TV.
VGA port	Connect a VGA display device, such as a monitor.
USB-C port	Connect devices with the USB-C port.

Connecting your computer to a TV, monitor, or projector

When watching movies or giving a presentation, connect your computer to an external display device such as a TV, monitor, or projector for a better viewing experience.

- i** Before connecting, check the type of port in the computer and external devices. Prepare an HDMI or VGA adapter if necessary.



- 1** Connect your computer to a TV, monitor, or projector using a MateDock 2, as shown in the figure.
- 2** Connect your external display device to a power supply and turn it on.
- 3** Click  in the bottom right corner of the screen to open the ACTION CENTER.
- 4** Click **Project** to select the projection method.
 - **PC screen only:** Only displays the desktop on your computer. The external display device will show a blank screen.
 - **Duplicate:** The desktop is displayed on both the computer and the external display.
 - **Extend:** You can extend computer desktop to an external display, and transfer items from your computer to the external display.
 - **Second screen only:** Only displays the desktop on the external display device. Your computer will display a blank screen.

Connecting a USB mouse, printer, or other peripheral device




Use the USB-C port on your computer to connect a USB mouse, printer, scanner, smartphone, hard drive, or other peripheral device.

Connecting a USB device

- 1** Plug the USB cable of your device into the USB Type-C port on your MateDock 2.


- 2 If the USB device requires a power supply, plug it in before powering it on.
- 3 The first time you connect a new USB device, your computer will automatically install any drivers that are required.

Viewing connected devices on your computer

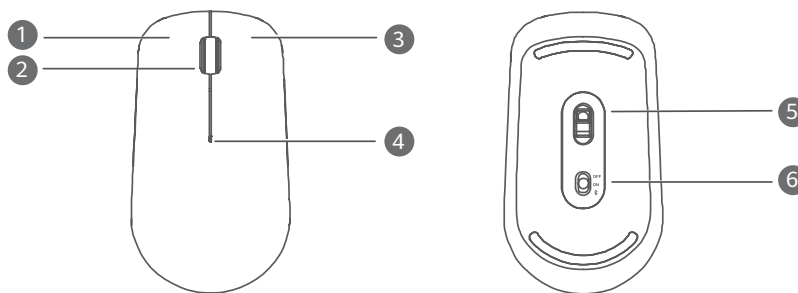
- 1 Click  in the lower left corner of the screen to open the Start menu.
- 2 Click  >  to view connected USB devices under connected devices.


Bluetooth mouse

HUAWEI/HONOR Bluetooth mouse can connect to a computer wirelessly via Bluetooth. When using the Bluetooth mouse for the first time, you need to pair the mouse with your computer.

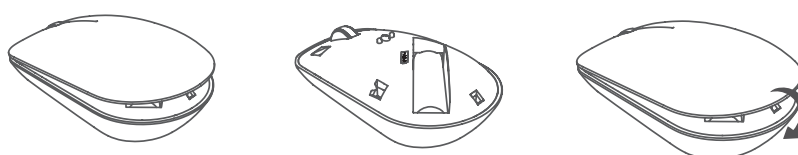

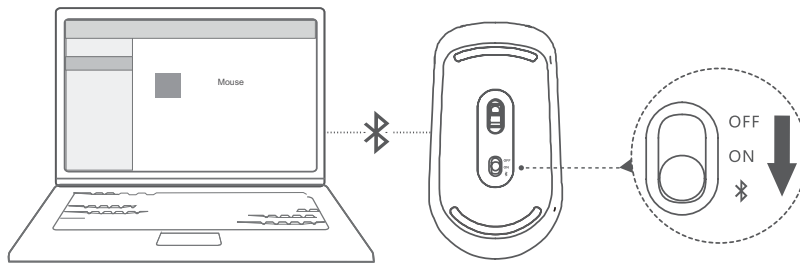
1	Left button	2	Scroll-wheel + Middle button

Install the battery

As illustrated below, open the front casing at the mark located on the bottom edge of the mouse. Insert one AA battery with the positive and negative ends as shown in the battery chamber. Close the casing to complete installation.



Pairing the Bluetooth mouse with your computer



- 1** Toggle the Bluetooth pairing switch at the bottom of the mouse to  for approximately 3 seconds until the indicator begins flashing, which indicates that the mouse has entered Pairing mode, as shown in the figure.
- 2** From your computer, open the Bluetooth pairing screen in Settings and select **Add Bluetooth device**. Once your computer enters Bluetooth pairing mode, select **HUAWEI/HONOR Mouse** to complete the pairing.

Appendix

Safety information

This section contains important information about the operation of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.


Electronic device

Do not use your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device if doing so causes danger or interference with other electronic devices.

Interference with medical equipment

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device where prohibited.
- Some wireless devices may affect the performance of hearing aids or pacemakers. Consult your service provider for more information.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be maintained between a device and a pacemaker to prevent potential interference with the pacemaker. If using a pacemaker, hold the device on the side opposite the pacemaker and do not carry the device in your front pocket.

Protecting your hearing when using a headset

-  To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.
- Using a headset at high volumes may damage your hearing. To reduce this risk, lower the headset volume to a safe and comfortable level.
- Exposure to high volumes while driving may cause distraction and increase your risk of an accident.

Areas with flammables and explosives

- Do not use the device where flammables or explosives are stored (in a gas station, oil depot, or chemical plant, for example). Using your device in these environments increases the risk of explosion or fire. In addition, follow the instructions indicated in text or symbols.
- Do not store or transport the device in containers with flammable liquids, gases, or explosives.

Traffic security

- Observe local laws and regulations while using the device. To reduce the risk of accidents, do not use your wireless device while driving.
- Concentrate on driving. Your first responsibility is to drive safely.

Operating environment

- Do not place sharp metal objects, such as pins, near the earpiece or speaker. The earpiece may attract these objects and result in injury.
- Stop using your device or applications for a while if the device is overheated. If skin is exposed to an overheated device for an extended period, low temperature burn symptoms, such as red spots and darker pigmentation, may occur.
- Do not touch the device's antenna. Otherwise, communication quality may be reduced.
- Do not allow children or pets to bite or suck the device or accessories. Doing so may result in damage or explosion.
- Observe local laws and regulations, and respect the privacy and legal rights of others.

Child's safety

- Comply with all precautions with regard to child's safety. Letting children play with the device or its accessories may be dangerous. The device includes detachable parts that may present a choking hazard. Keep away from children.

Accessories

- Using an unapproved or incompatible power adapter, charger or battery may cause fire, explosion or other hazards.

Charger safety

- For pluggable devices, the socket-outlet shall be installed near the devices and shall be easily accessible.
- Unplug the charger from electrical outlets and the device when not in use.
- Do not drop or cause an impact to the charger.
- If the power cable is damaged (for example, the cord is exposed or broken), or the plug loosens, stop using it at once. Continued use may lead to electric shocks, short circuits, or fire.
- Do not touch the power cord with wet hands or pull the power cord to disconnect the charger.
- Do not touch the device or the charger with wet hands. Doing so may lead to short circuits, malfunctions, or electric shocks.
- If your charger has been exposed to water, other liquids, or excessive moisture, take it to a Huawei authorized service center for inspection.

Battery safety

- Do not connect battery poles with conductors, such as keys, jewelry, or other metal materials. Doing so may short-circuit the battery and cause injuries or burns.
- Keep the battery away from excessive heat and direct sunlight. Do not place it on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode if overheated.
- Do not attempt to modify or remanufacture the battery, insert foreign objects into it, or immerse or expose it to water or other liquids. Doing so may lead to fire, explosion, or other hazards.

Cleaning and maintenance
