(Anthriscus Sylvestris)

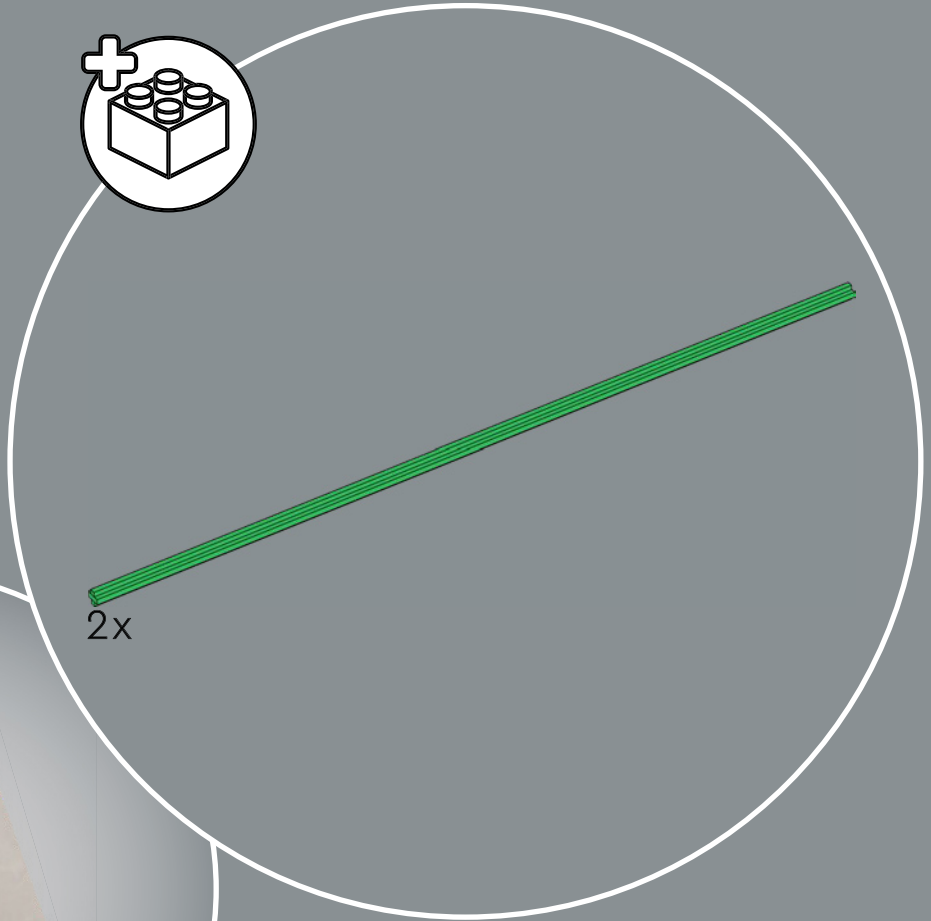
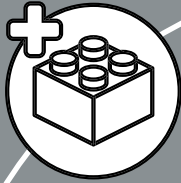

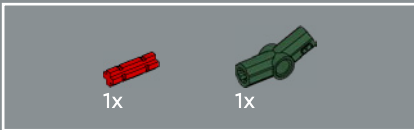
WELSH POPPY

(Centaurea cyanus)

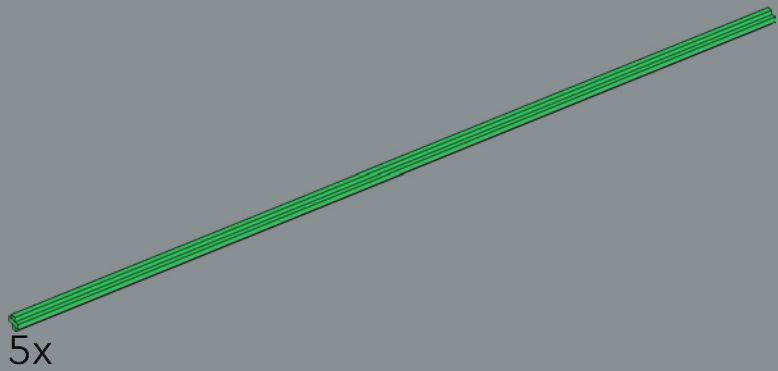
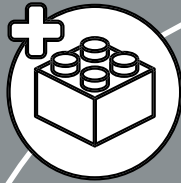

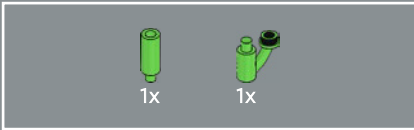
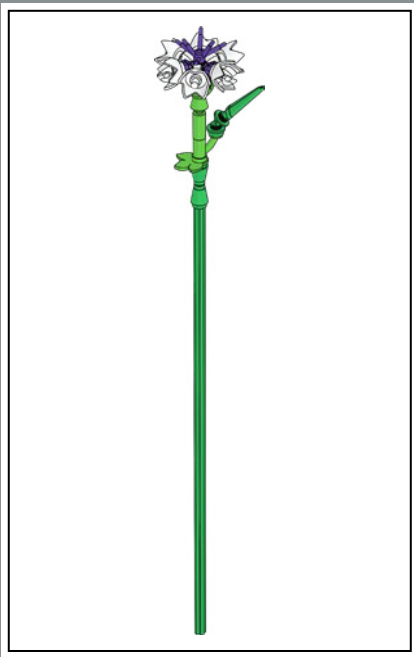


LAVENDER

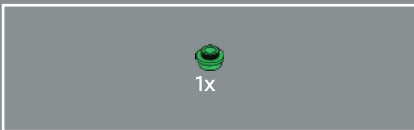
(Lavandula)

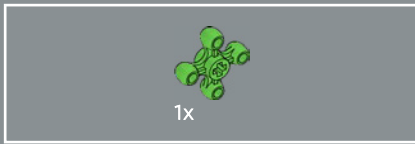
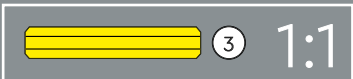
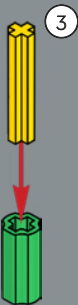
(Gerbera jamesonii)
