





# 2.1 Connection




# 2.2 Get Your Smart Display Ready for Use

### Insert the SD card

1 Insert a SD card if desired on the back of your smart display.

### **Connect the Power Cord**

Connect the included power cord to the power jack.



**2** Connect the other end of the power cord to a power outlet.

## 2.3 Power on Your Device

- After connecting the power cord, you can press the power button about 0.5 seconds to power on your device.
- 2 Once powered-up, the LED indicator will show solid Blue.
- The unlock display will appear after a short boot-up period. (If the lock screen function is enabled).
- 4 Touch and slide the lock icon to unlock the screen if necessary.
- **5** The device is ready for use when the Home screen is displayed.

# 2.4 Power Off Your Device



- 1 Press and hold the power button for about 3 seconds.
- **2** When the power off menu appears, touch **OK**.

# 3 About Your VSD243 Smart Display

## 3.1 Touch Screen

To navigate and interact on the display, use your finger to touch the sensitive surface of the screen directly. You can manipulate icons, buttons, menu items, on-screen keyboard and other items on the touch screen with the following methods:

Methods	Descriptions
Touch	Simply touch the items with you finger.  - Tap on items on the screen including application and settings icons.  - Type letters and symbols using the on-screen keyboard.  - Press the on-screen buttons.
Touch and Hold	Touch and hold an item on the screen by touching it without lifting your finger until an action occurs.
Drag	Touch and hold an item then move the item with your finger until reaching the target position.  - Move an item on the screen.  - Scroll through Home screens, web pages, lists, entries, photo thumbnails, contacts and so on.
Swipe or Slide	Quickly move your finger across the surface of the screen without pausing when you first touch it.
Zoom Out	Move two fingers close together on the screen to reduce the view of an image or web page.
Zoom In	Move two fingers apart on the screen to enlarge the view of an image or web page.

## NOTE

You can connect the three dots to zoom the entire display frequency, also with two
fingers to rotate and zoom the display, as well as voice output designed specifically for
blind users and gesture mode navigation features.

## 3.2 Applications, Widgets and Shortcuts

The soft buttons or icons offer a variety of functions and shortcuts. On the Home screen, it is your starting point to access all the features on your device. It displays application icons, widgets, shortcuts and so on.

**Applications:** Software allows you to perform a specific task. Power on your device, and it is preloaded with a variety of applications already. You can also download additional applications from the Aptoide store.

**Widgets:** Widgets are applications that you can use directly on the Home screen. Example: Clock, Picture frame, and so on.

**Shortcuts:** A link that you can create on your Home screen to provide quicker access to applications you have installed.

## 3.3 Home Screen

Once you power on your device, the central Home screen will be displayed first. On the Home screen, it allows you to put short cut that installed on your device.

The Home screen is composed of two screen panels. You can slide your finger left or right across the central Home screen to view more widgets, shortcuts, and other items located on each screen panel. You can also add shortcuts, widgets or change the desktop wallpaper on each screen panel.

# 3.4 Customizing Your Home Screen

## 3.4.1 Add an Item (Shortcut)

- On the Apps screen, touch APPS or WIDGETS tab to enter APPS or WIDGETS configuration screen.
- Select one of the APPS or WIDGETS item that you want to add.
- Touch and hold the item to add it onto the selected Home screen.

### 3.4.2 Move an Item

- On the Home screen, touch and hold the item that you want to move.
- Move the item to the new position.
- Then release your finger to add the item to the new position.

### 3.4.3 Delete an Item

- On the Home screen, touch and hold the item that you want to delete such as a widget or shortcut.
- An "X Remove" will soon be displayed at the top of the Home screen.
- Drag the item over the "X Remove".
- Then release your finger to delete the item.

## 3.4.4 Change the Wallpaper



- · Touch and hold an empty space on the screen.
- A "Choose wallpaper from" configuration screen will appear.
- Select one of the wallpaper sources by touching the specific icon.
- Tap on the desired wallpaper image.
- Once finishing the wallpaper selection, touch "**Set wallpaper**" to update the wallpaper on the Home screen.
- Some wallpapers allows you to change the wallpaper color, ex. Magic Smoke. If "Settings..." displays during the wallpaper changing, touch it. On the top of screen, it displays "Tap to change". Touch the screen to configure the wallpaper color. Tap the screen to cycle through the various colors.

• You can touch the **Back** button to return to the previous screen without making any change.

## NOTE

• All Home Screens share the same background. You cannot set different wallpapers to individual Home Screen panel.

# 3.5 Connecting to HDMI-compliant Devices via HDMI Input

HDMI (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) is a compact audio/video interface for transferring uncompressed digital audio/video data. You can obtain the best user experience for video playback and gaming via HDMI. VSD243 is equipped with an HDMI input for connecting to an external HDMI-compliant device. You can connect your PC, notebook, Blu-ray player or any other HDMI-compliant device to the VSD243 as a high-definition video display.

## How to begin

- 1 A type A HDMI to type A HDMI cable must be available.
- **2** Connect one end of the HDMI cable to the HDMI compliant source.
- For a computer connection, always set the appropriate resolution. The VSD243 supports resolution up to 1920x1080.

## 4 OSD Menu





Press the **Menu/Exit** button on bottom right of your VSD243 to launch the OSD configuration screen. The OSD configuration screen can be used to configure the Contrast/Brightness, Input Select, Audio Adjust, Color Adjust, Information, Manual Image Adjust, Setup Menu and Memory Recall.

## 4.1 Adjustment Bars

## Contrast/Brightness:

**Contrast:** Select and drag the slider on the **Contrast** bar to adjust the contrast of the display. Drag the slider to the right to increase the contrast. By default, the contrast is set to 70.

**Brightness:** Select and drag the slider on the **Brightness** bar to adjust the brightness of your screen. Drag the slider to the rightto increase the brightness. By default, the brightness is set to 100.

## Audio Adjust:

Select and drag the slider on the **Volume** bar to adjust the volume. As you drag the slider to the right, the volume is louder. By default, the volume is set to 50. Here you can Mute the audio or Listen to other sounds.

# 4.2 Functions items

**Input Select:** Select the input source from either HDMI or Android. Connect the HDMI cable to other HDMI source first before selecting the HDMI input.

**Color Adjust:** Available seletions are sRGB, Bluish, Cool, Native, Warm and user color.

**Information:** Select this item to show the information about your VSD243 such as the Resolution, H.Frequency, V.Frequency, Pixel Clock, Model Number and Website.

**Manual Image Adjust:** Available adjustments are Sharpness, Dynamic Contrast, Aspect Ratio, Overscan, ECO Mode, ViewMode and Blue Light Filter.


**Setup Menu:** Available settings are Language Selection, Resolution Notice, OSD Position, OSD Time Out, OSD Background, Power Indicator, and Sleep.


### **Memory Recall:**

Select the Memory Recall function to restore the OSD configurations back to factory settings.

### NOTE

- OSD language supports are English, Deutsch (German), Francais (French), Italian, Spanish, Japanese, Simplified Chinese and Traditional Chinese.
- ViewMode provides "Standard, Game, Movie, Web, Text, and Mono" mode settings for optimum image quality.
- The Blue Light Filter setting allows user adjustable reduction of high energy blue light for reduced eye strain.





## 4.3 OSD Notice

## idling:

The OSD menu will close and return to the original processed OSD menu after the OSD time out value expired.

## No signal:

- There is no HDMI connection.
- The connected HDMI source and your smart display is not active. Make sure the HDMI source is not in Off, Standby, Hibernate or Sleep mode.

# 4.4 OSD and Hot keys setting

**OSD Lock:** Press and hold the OSD menu [**□**] and the up arrow [**△**] for 10 seconds to set. If any buttons are pressed, the message **OSD Locked** will display for 3 seconds.

**OSD Unlock:** Press and hold [**■**] and the up arrow [**△**] again for 10 seconds to unlock.

**Power Button Lock:** Press and hold [☐] and the down arrow [▼] for 10 seconds to set. If the power button is pressed, the message **Power Button Locked** will display for 3 seconds. With or without this setting, after a power failure, your LCD display's power will automatically turn ON when power is restored.

**Power Button Unlock:** Press and hold [**■**] and the down arrow [**▼**] again for 10 seconds to unlock.

**DDC/CI enable/disable:** Press [▶] and [▼] keys at the same time to toggle SSC/CI and DDC/2B (DDC/CI enable/disable) to allow the computer to send specific Monitor Control Command Set (MCCS) to command the devices, as well as receive sensor data from the devices, over a bidirectional link.

# **5 Troubleshooting**

# 5.1 Touch Screen Problems

Problems	Causes	Solutions
Touch screen does not respond to hand gestures or render	power noise during device turn on process	Reconnect the USB cable.
them properly.	Water drop or spot above the glass surface.	Clean and remove the water drop then reconnect the USB cable.
The touch function on the VSD243 HDMI Mode does not work properly when the USB cable is connected to the USB Type-B connector	Pc screen resolution settings of Multiple Displays are incorrectly set to "duplicate these displays."	Change computer resolution settings from "duplicate these displays" to "show desktop only on 2" (VSD243)

# 5.2 Other Problems

Problems	Solutions
No power	If the power LED is not blue - Ensure that the power adaptor is plugged to the correct electrical outlet Ensure that the DC connector is fully inserted into the correct socket on the rear of the VSD243 located under the cover - Check the power outlet with another device (i.e. table lamp) - If there is still has no power then contact ViewSonic support or the Reseller from whom the device was purchased.
No image	Check external HDMI source and its connection.
Lock-up	Restart VSD243 device.
App doesn't function	Check with App developer.
No network	Check WiFi settings, try wired Ethernet cable if available.
No audio	Check volume level setting.
